This course has 72 class hours, including 40 lecture hours, professor 10 office hours, 10-hour TA discussion sessions, 2-hour review sessions, 10-hour extra classes.

**Course Description**

This course provides a survey of the laws affecting business operations. We will review the sources of law and the basis for ethical analysis of legal issues. We will review federal and state legal procedure, administrative law, and cover certain aspects of international law. We will review key features of constitutional law as it affects business and the laws governing contracts, sales, employment, business organizations, intellectual property, torts, business crimes, negligence, and product liability. We will also explore dispute resolution mechanisms. Case law analysis will be used to identify issues, illustrate legal concepts, and generate discussion of the pertinent legal theories.



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**Overall Course Objectives:**

This course will provide a basic understanding of the key aspects of the laws affecting business. We will focus on basic elements, issue recognition, evaluation of specific legal issues, and the relevant ethical considerations facing business persons. Supplemental information in lectures will stress those aspects of the text material on which you will need to focus and provide additional examples of the application of the law to business situations.
